

## Cliff Park Junior Pupil Premium Impact statement 2016-2017

### *Data impact plus results*

At Cliff Park we recognise that Pupil premium funding must be used to raise attainment and progress for all disadvantaged children. Extra support and interventions for our children in receipt of pupil premium funding are reviewed on a regular basis and have a strong focus during half termly pupil progress meetings. Interventions and extra support for children has been constantly reviewed and as a result a system of 'pick and fix' is now in place alongside specific interventions as necessary. This has reduced the amount of time children are away from class and therefore continue to have the access to quality first teaching.
